Coos County

Spring Award to: Medallion Opera House, Inc.

Project: Comprehensive upgrade to its sound and lighting infrastructure and systems that expand the range of performances the theater can host increasing its appeal to larger bands and groups and fulfilling its mission of cultural enrichment.

Spring Award to: Affordable Housing, Education and Development (AHEAD) Inc.

Project: Rehabilitation of the interior and exterior of 12 King Square in Whitefield, a currently shuttered building. The rehabilitation will construct a new layout of the second and third stories creating four residential units and one commercial unit.

openings in the state.

Fall Award to: Town of Wolfeboro

Project: Funds will be used to make necessary electrical grid upgrades to public infrastructure (Wolfeboro uses a municipally-owned utility), which will allow PSI Molded Plastics to add 4 new injection molding machines and 15-20 new jobs. PSI is contributing the local match for this project.

Fall Award to: Mt. Washington Valley Trails Association

Upon completion, this center will feature hybrid space for large and small group meetings, a business center, a staffed information hub, kitchenette and water filling station, public bathrooms, Wi-Fi and computer access, and AC/heat. These improvements will assist the library in providing services to the surge of new library users they have seen since Covid (such as home-based and remote workers).

These simulators are also intended to be used by local technical education centers.

This facility is located on the border of the Dartmouth medical campus in Lebanon and will develop with support from the hospital. The facility itself will host 25-30 new jobs and integrate with the Geisel School of Medicine and other local educational institutions to offer preceptorships.
